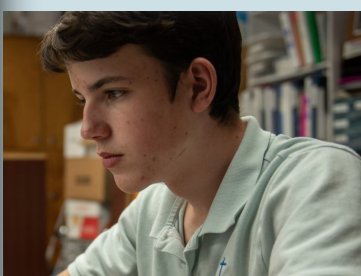

History

Established in 2010, Community Christian School of Baraboo (CCS) is a private, non-denominational Christian school teaching preschool through 12th grade with a classically inspired, Christ-centered emphasis. At CCS, students are immersed in a supportive and nurturing community that fosters their personal and intellectual growth. The school's dedicated faculty and staff are passionate about education and are deeply invested in the success of each student. They provide a comprehensive curriculum that integrates rigorous academics with Christian values, equipping students with a strong foundation of knowledge, critical thinking skills, and a deep understanding of their faith.

Mission

Service

Acts of service are a critical component to the emotional and spiritual development of our students. As such, we require at least 10 hours of service to be completed each year of high school. This must be completed outside of school hours.

AP Courses

The AP course offering varies each year. Course offerings have included AP Psychology, AP English Literature and Composition, and AP US History.

Weighted Grades

All courses are graded on a 4.0 scale regardless of content or rigor. **CCS does not currently weight classes.** The student's transcripts detail the AP courses taken and grades achieved, though no additional weight is given.

Curriculum

CCS offers courses that meet a student's specific academic needs. We offer college preparatory courses, as well as courses geared toward a non-college future. The academic year consists of two semesters with the following expected course load:

Freshman – Junior Level: Seven courses and one study hall

Senior: Six courses and one study hall

Students may take additional courses beyond the standard course load if requested.

HS Honor Roll Standards and Class Rank

CCS has two high school honor rolls calculated as an average of all classes completed. Honor roll is awarded each semester to students with averages detailed below, who are enrolled in at least five classes. CCS does not publish a class rank for our graduating seniors.
